

## Rules for determining High Point Placings

Points are given on the following basis –

- regular A level shows – 1st place = 6 pts, 2nd place = 5 pts etc to 6th place.  
Double points for Championship classes.
- Regional Championship shows – Champion = 18 pts, Reserve = 15 pts, remaining Top 5 = 12 pts.
- National Championship shows – Champion = 24 pts, Reserve = 20 pts, remaining Top 10 = 16 pts.
- Only AAHABC and R17 Championship (when show is hosted in Lower Mainland BC) shows count towards High Point category awards. AAHABC Junior/Amateur show classes only count towards Junior and Amateur categories as open classes are restricted (by the nature of the show).
- All remaining shows (including Nationals, Breeders, other BC club shows, etc) count only towards the Out-Of-Club award.

The following categories are all based on the horse only, not the horse/handler or horse/rider combination. Also, except where noted, these categories are all separated to Arabian and Half-Arabian.

Open halter – separated to Geldings, Mares, Stallions and Junior Horse

- Only points from open classes count (age splits are valid as long as all ages are included).
- Yearlings and two year olds count towards junior horse only (any sex). Weanlings are not eligible for high points.
- Horse must be owned by a current member in good standing.

Amateur halter – no separation based on sex of horse or age of amateur.

- AOTH classes will not count unless offered to all sex divisions.
- Horse must be owned by current member in good standing.
- Handler must be current member in good standing.

Open riding classes –

- Horse must be owned by current member in good standing.
- Include open classes only (no limit, novice, maiden, junior).
- Classes restricted by sex are allowed only if all sexes are offered class options (ie geldings, mares & stallions, ladies & gentlemen to ride).

Junior amateur riding classes – both JTR and JOTR are allowed.

- Horse must be owned by current member in good standing.
- Rider must be current member in good standing.
- No rider restrictions allowed (ie limited rider, select rider).
- Age restrictions allowed only if all ages are offered.
- Juniors riding in ATR classes only receive points if no Junior classes are offered.
- Walk-Trot include both Western and English types, is not separated by breed and does not allow cross-entry of rider with JTR or JOTR classes.
